Fire Fighting / EMT

Fire fighting is a program where seniors and juniors prepare for the transition of continued education in a fire academy, to a future employment potentially in the field. Those enrolled in this program have the ability to learn technical skills in fire behavior, bunker gear use, and breathing apparatus. In addition, this program teaches students the necessary skills needed for forcible entry and rescue operations, as well as the handling of fire hose and other appliances. It is no secret that this class is very physical as it requires a student to get dirty and sweaty just like they would do in the fire service. Students are also given the opportunity to train multiple times a week at the Pontiac Fire Department Headquarters.

EMT is a program partnered with OSF, and was created to prepare students for caring and handling potentially critically ill or injured individuals. This senior course focuses on the development of one's skills needed to assess individuals afflicted by illness while still applying proper emergency procedures. In addition, this course follows the IDPH guidelines when in the field and behind the desk. Students will have the opportunity to work in the ER, ride in an ambulance, and respond to real time emergencies. Afterwards, those who enrolled, and successfully completed this course will be eligible for the national registry EMT basic licensure exam.

Both of these courses offer students the oppurtunity to compete in SkillsUSA and last year LACC sent four students from these courses. Aeden McDowell competed in the category of firefighting and finished 5th overall in the State. Aeden was also one of the 2022-2023 LACC students of the year.
